

Approximately 550 of the Nation's School Districts Use a Four-Day Schedule²








What is the percentage of students who were chronically

WACO DATA

Waco has been doing four day week since fall of 2013 and have seen many improvements.

Waco's student attendance averaged 88% before moving to four day weeks and then 94% attendance after they switched. They believe that this helped because students and teachers both had a day where they could make appointments and plans leaving no excuses on why they can't show up to school. Tim Bartels, Waco's principal, says "it's not about the week, its about what the week can do for the staff and students."

PD Times/ days

At Waco their teachers come in every other Friday (their day during the week they have off). They just have to come for the morning then are free to leave in the afternoon.


- Students- increases opportunities allowing them to get jobs. The students also have time to get extra help on Fridays or makeup tests. Groups like student council can use Friday mornings to meet and get things ready for big events like blood drive, homecoming, and more. Sports teams at Waco have also had the opportunities to use the mornings for walk-throughs.
- Teachers- Longer class periods have lead their students to have more engagement in the classroom, which allows teachers to be able to teach better. Mrs. Reichenbach said that after Waco made the shift to 56- minute class periods her students started learning more.
- Families- More family time and less time being on a bus, eating lunch, and just having the breaks from learning allowing students to be able to learn more things.



Teacher Recruitment** – The US is in a teacher shortage, so they hope that the four day week will trigger intrest in getting new teachers to apply at their school 4. Student Achievement- WMU wants to appove their schools student and teacher morale

WMU is not having school on Mondays because they think that Fridays are seen more like free days rather than a day that can be used for work. 
What is going to happen on Mondays with sports?

"Because some people need the rest for a better mental health and need a break from school."


"For mental awareness, people feel more refreshed after a three day break and come back to school ready to learn"

"Other school systems in the area do it and have much healthier education environments."



"Because students tend to get exhausted going to school 5 days a week and it makes students skip more because there so exhausted. I also feel it gives students more time to do homework."




How much information do you know about four day school weeks?



What is going to happen on the day five in the highschool?

Every other Monday or Friday would be used for intervention for kids that are failing or just need extra help to get the attention that they need. This time would help get our F's up and to allow students that struggle to get the deserved help. Some kids could be pulled to come in on Monday just like when you are pulled for flight. We would use a bus or a van to get kids to school for that day.
